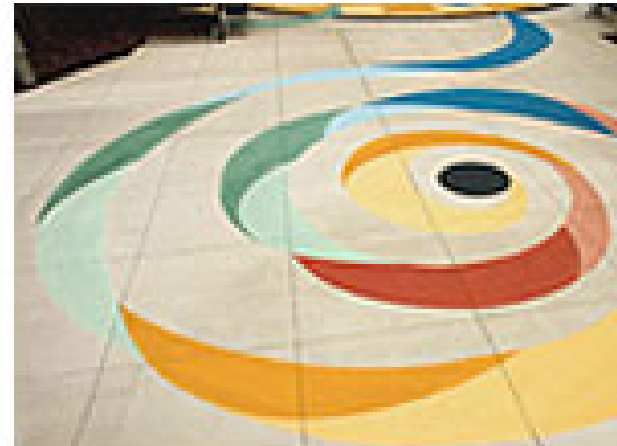
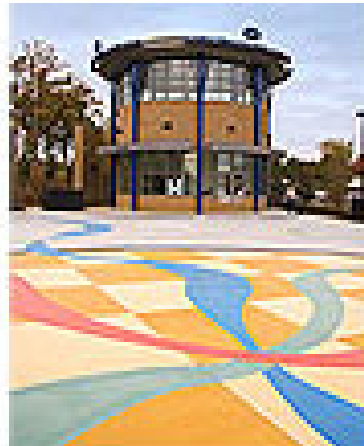

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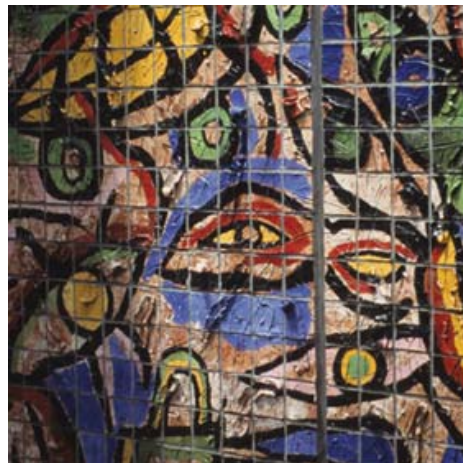
Charlotte Area Transit System

- Using swirling, colorful pathways, Elizabeth Indianos enlivens the plaza at Eastland Community Transit Center with her concrete paving design.
- The artist worked with the Eastland project team and community representatives to create a design focus for the facility that reflects a place of diverse cultures.
- The art instills a sense of vitality and playfulness into the facility.
- The project includes passenger shelters, a landscaped open-air plaza, driver's comfort station, pedestrian pathways, and passenger information.



Miami Dade Transit System

- Art in Public Spaces at Miami Dade Transit Metrorail stations ranges from a red undulating, spiral sculpture to hand glazed ceramic tiles to a hand-crafted ceramic mural.
- Neon lighting installed on both sides of the Metrorail bridge over the Miami River, created the multicolored Miami Line which has become a signature component of the Miami cityscape.



Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority

- The WMATA art-in-transit program includes painted murals of bold, brightly colored, stylized images of local architecture.
- For the Rosslyn rail station the dynamic skyline was used to create a colorful and inviting gateway to the community.
- For the Metro Center Station, the painted mural depicts scenes of built and natural environments in the Nation's Capital.
- At the Glenmont Station, the stylized iridescent imagery depicts bold images of birds, stars and the sky that soften the crisp geometry of the building structures



SoundTransit (Seattle)

- The Sound Transit art program, SStart, brings an artist's perspective to what is mainly an engineering and architectural project. Besides improving the appearance and safety of transit facilities, art helps patrons feel welcome. Art reflects the community, involves the community and opens up opportunities for small businesses and minorities.
