

# Light Rail & Private Utility Construction Update

## December 14, 2009



### FORT NORFOLK

- Colley/Brambleton: Partial intersection closure
  - Work to install rail across Colley Avenue (at Brambleton) is permitted to start on 12.17.09 and will be completed in phases.
    - Two way traffic is maintained
    - Riverview Avenue and Second Street will be open to assist eastbound motorists on Brambleton Avenue.
  - Duration of work is approximately 90 days

### YORK

- Light Rail
  - Botetourt
    - Left turn lane from westbound Brambleton returns upon completion of median work later this week
    - "No right turn" sign will be reinstalled per community request early this week
  - Paving will be completed between Botetourt and Dunmore street later this week

### DUKE

- Light Rail
  - Track installation outside of the roadway continues between York and Bute Streets
  - The intersection of Duke/Bute will not be under construction until early 2010.

### BUTE

- Light Rail: Installation of OCS foundations, water and storm drain underway
  - Road closed to thru traffic between Duke and Boush
  - York Street parking garage is accessible only on York Street during this work

### BOUSH STREET

- Phase one is underway.
  - Two way traffic is on east side of Boush Street
  - Pedestrian crosswalk located on the north side of the Boush/Bute intersection

### CHARLOTTE

- Light Rail & Utility Work
  - Construction activity between Boush and Monticello continues. Charlotte Street is open to local traffic to maintain access to all parking lots and building entrance/exit points.
  - Signage is in place directing pedestrian traffic to Bute Street.
  - The intersection of Granby/Charlotte will not be under construction until early 2010.

### MONTICELLO (Charlotte to Freemason)

- Verizon
  - Relocation of manhole underway on the southwest corner of the intersection (Charlotte/Monticello)
  - Charlotte Street, east of Monticello Avenue should be open by the end of this week
- Light Rail
  - Monticello Avenue is closed between Freemason and Charlotte Street through the end of January
